
#### **Takeaways**

- As of 2024 the region's population **declined by 7.3**% since 2019, falling by 4,159. Population is expected to **decrease by 4.6**% between 2024 and 2029, losing 2,414.
- From 2019 to 2024, jobs declined by 8.4% in 4 Arkansas Counties from 20,090 to 18,399. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 3.9% by 12.3%. As the number of jobs declined, the labor force participation rate decreased from 51.2% to 49.9% between 2019 and 2024.
- Concerning educational attainment, 9.3% of the selected regions' residents possess a Bachelor's Degree (12.1% below the national average), and 7.0% hold an Associate's Degree (1.9% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2024 are Crop Production, Education and Hospitals (Local Government), and Restaurants and Other Eating Places.











## **Job Trends**






















## **Top Industry Employment Concentration**








## **Top Occupation Employment Concentration**




