Regional average earnings per job are \$27.9K below the national average earnings of \$65.7K per job.


Takeaways

- From 2013 to 2018, jobs declined by 1.9% in 5 Arkansas Counties from 23,407 to 22,969. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 8.2% by 10.1%. As the number of jobs declined, the labor force participation rate decreased from 51.9% to 49.4% between 2013 and 2018.
- Concerning educational attainment, **7.9% of the selected regions' residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (10.7% below the national average), and **7.0% hold an Associate's Degree** (1.0% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2018 are Animal Slaughtering and Processing, Education and Hospitals (Local Government), and Restaurants and Other Eating Places.






Millennials


Retiring Soon




Racial Diversity








Top Growing Industries






Top Industry LQ






Top Industry GRP









Educational Pipeline

In 2017, there were 261 graduates in 5 Arkansas Counties. This pipeline has shrunk by 18% over the last 5 years. The highest share of these graduates come from Nursing Assistant/Aide and Patient Care Assistant/Aide, Liberal Arts and Sciences/Liberal Studies, and "Multi-/Interdisciplinary Studies, Other".
