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- As of 2018 the region's population **declined by 5.5%** since 2013, falling by 9,321. Population is expected to **decrease by 4.4%** between 2018 and 2023, losing 7,145.
- From 2013 to 2018, jobs declined by 3.9% in 8 Arkansas Counties from 66,751 to 64,133. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 8.2% by 12.1%. As the number of jobs declined, the labor force participation rate decreased from 51.4% to 48.1% between 2013 and 2018.
- Concerning educational attainment, **10.6% of the selected regions' residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (8.0% below the national average), and **5.4% hold an Associate's Degree** (2.7% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2018 are Education and Hospitals (Local Government), State Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals, and Restaurants and Other Eating Places.




Job Trends














Top Growing Industries



Industry Jobs Growth




Top Industry GRP







Top Growing Occupations






Top Occupation Earnings


Top Posted Occupations
