
- As of 2018 the region's population increased by 0.6% since 2013, growing by 29. Population is expected to increase by 0.2% between 2018 and 2023, adding 12.
- From 2013 to 2018, jobs increased by 13.0% in Calhoun County, AR from 2,777 to 3,138. This change outpaced the national growth rate of 8.2% by 4.8%. As the number of jobs increased, the labor force participation rate decreased from 55.5% to 53.2% between 2013 and 2018.
- Concerning educational attainment, **8.6% of Calhoun County**, **AR residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (10.0% below the national average), and **7.1% hold an Associate's Degree** (0.9% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2018 are Other Fabricated Metal Product Manufacturing, Other Chemical Product and Preparation Manufacturing, and Education and Hospitals (State Government).





Labor Force Participation Rate Trends





Calhoun County, AR had a January 2019 unemployment rate of 5.90%, decreasing from 6.58% 5 years before.






Millennials

Calhoun County, AR has 440 veterans. The national average for an area this size is 305.




Retiring Soon

Retirement risk is high in Calhoun County, AR. The national average for an area this size is 1,496 people 55 or older, while there are 1,934 here.




Violent Crime

Property Crime


Calhoun County, AR has 16.54 property crimes per 1,000 people. The national rate is 24.21 per 1,000 people.








Top Industry LQ








Top Growing Occupations






Top Occupation LQ








