Takeaways

- As of 2018 the region's population **declined by 10.0**% since 2013, falling by 769. Population is expected to **decrease by 9.5**% between 2018 and 2023, losing 655.
- From 2013 to 2018, jobs declined by 9.7% in Monroe County, AR from 2,693 to 2,433. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 8.2% by 17.9%. As the number of jobs declined, the labor force participation rate decreased from 51.6% to 47.3% between 2013 and 2018.
- Concerning educational attainment, **7.6% of Monroe County**, **AR residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (11.0% below the national average), and **4.6% hold an Associate's Degree** (3.4% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2018 are Education and Hospitals (Local Government), Restaurants and Other Eating Places, and Individual and Family Services.






Unemployment Rate Trends


Millennials

Monroe County, AR has 1,089 millennials (ages 20-34). The national average for an area this size is 1,467.




Veterans

Monroe County, AR has 507 veterans. The national average for an area this size is 412.




Retiring Soon

Retirement risk is high in Monroe County, AR. The national average for an area this size is 2,020 people 55 or older, while there are 2,748 here.




Violent Crime

Property Crime


Monroe County, AR has 24.55 property crimes per 1,000 people. The national rate is 24.21 per 1,000 people.







Top Industry LQ



Top Industry GRP




