- From 2013 to 2018, jobs declined by 0.9% in Newton County, AR from 1,477 to 1,463. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 8.2% by 9.1%. As the number of jobs declined, the labor force participation rate decreased from 53.2% to 51.2% between 2013 and 2018.
- Concerning educational attainment, **8.9% of Newton County, AR residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (9.7% below the national average), and **4.0% hold an Associate's Degree** (4.0% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2018 are Education and Hospitals (Local Government), Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals, and Nursing Care Facilities (Skilled Nursing Facilities).





Labor Force Participation Rate Trends






Unemployment Rate Trends




Millennials

Newton County, AR has 1,121 millennials (ages 20-34). The national average for an area this size is 1,621.




Newton County, AR has 656 veterans. The national average for an area this size is 455.

Retirement risk is high in Newton County, AR. The national average for an area this size is 2,232 people 55 or older, while there are 3,281 here.




Violent Crime








Top Growing Industries








Top Growing Occupations










