- From 2013 to 2018, jobs declined by 1.2% in Union County, AR from 19,681 to 19,451. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 8.2% by 9.4%. As the number of jobs declined, the labor force participation rate decreased from 50.7% to 50.6% between 2013 and 2018.
- Concerning educational attainment, **14.8% of Union County, AR residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (3.9% below the national average), and **7.1% hold an Associate's Degree** (0.9% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2018 are Restaurants and Other Eating Places, Education and Hospitals (Local Government), and Management of Companies and Enterprises.




Job Trends





Union County, AR had a January 2019 unemployment rate of 5.98%, decreasing from 7.38% 5 years before.




Millennials

Union County, AR has 6,884 millennials (ages 20-34). The national average for an area this size is 8,170.




Retiring Soon

Retirement risk is high in Union County, AR. The national average for an area this size is 11,246 people 55 or older, while there are 12,495 here.




Racial Diversity

Racial diversity is about average in Union County, AR. The national average for an area this size is 15,492 racially diverse people, while there are 15,440 here.




Veterans

Property Crime








Top Growing Industries



Industry Jobs Growth




Top Industry GRP






Top Growing Occupations



Occupation Jobs Growth




Top Occupation Earnings


